Intended Audience

This course is intended for all primary care providers and those specialists, including anesthesia, pain and addiction, internal medicine, OB-GYN, pediatrics, emergency medicine, ENT, neurology, hospitalists, and psychiatry, as well as pharmacists and other health care professionals (R.N., N.P., PA.) who are involved in the diagnosis and management of headache and chronic pain patients.


